



WHAT DOES THE PATHWAYS SCHOLARSHIP DO FOR ME?

The PATHWAYS Scholarship Program is a program guaranteeing every qualifying Perryton High School student access to a college education.

PATHWAYS Activities:

- Ongoing support during high school to encourage attendance and grades
- Financial Aid workshops to assist in applying for federal student aid
- Assistance in completion of college enrollment applications
- Special registration and orientation at Frank Phillips College Allen Campus
- Timely information to all PATHWAYS graduates to update and inform of important dates and requirements

What is meant by...Last Money In?

The PATHWAYS Scholarship Program wants to ensure that all PATHWAYS eligible Perryton High school students now and in the future are able to attend college. For this reason, PATHWAYS Scholarship funds are the “last money in”. Any federal government grants or scholarships received by the PATHWAYS student are first applied to books, tuition and fees. Any of these costs not covered by other forms of financial aid are then paid for by PATHWAYS for up to 60 credit hours as long as the students keep their PATHWAYS eligibility. PATHWAYS staff are available to assist students in completing this financial aid paperwork each year.

What benefits do I receive if federal aid or scholarships cover my college fees without the use of PATHWAYS funds?

PATHWAYS students can remain in the PATHWAYS Scholarship Program for as long as they meet the PATHWAYS requirements. PATHWAYS will pay for books, tuition, and fees if your financial situation changes and you no longer qualify for federal funds. All PATHWAYS college students continue to receive services through the PATHWAYS office. These services are:

- Assistance with completion of college forms
- Ongoing support from the PATHWAYS director and committee
